EL RITUAL Y LA MUERTE

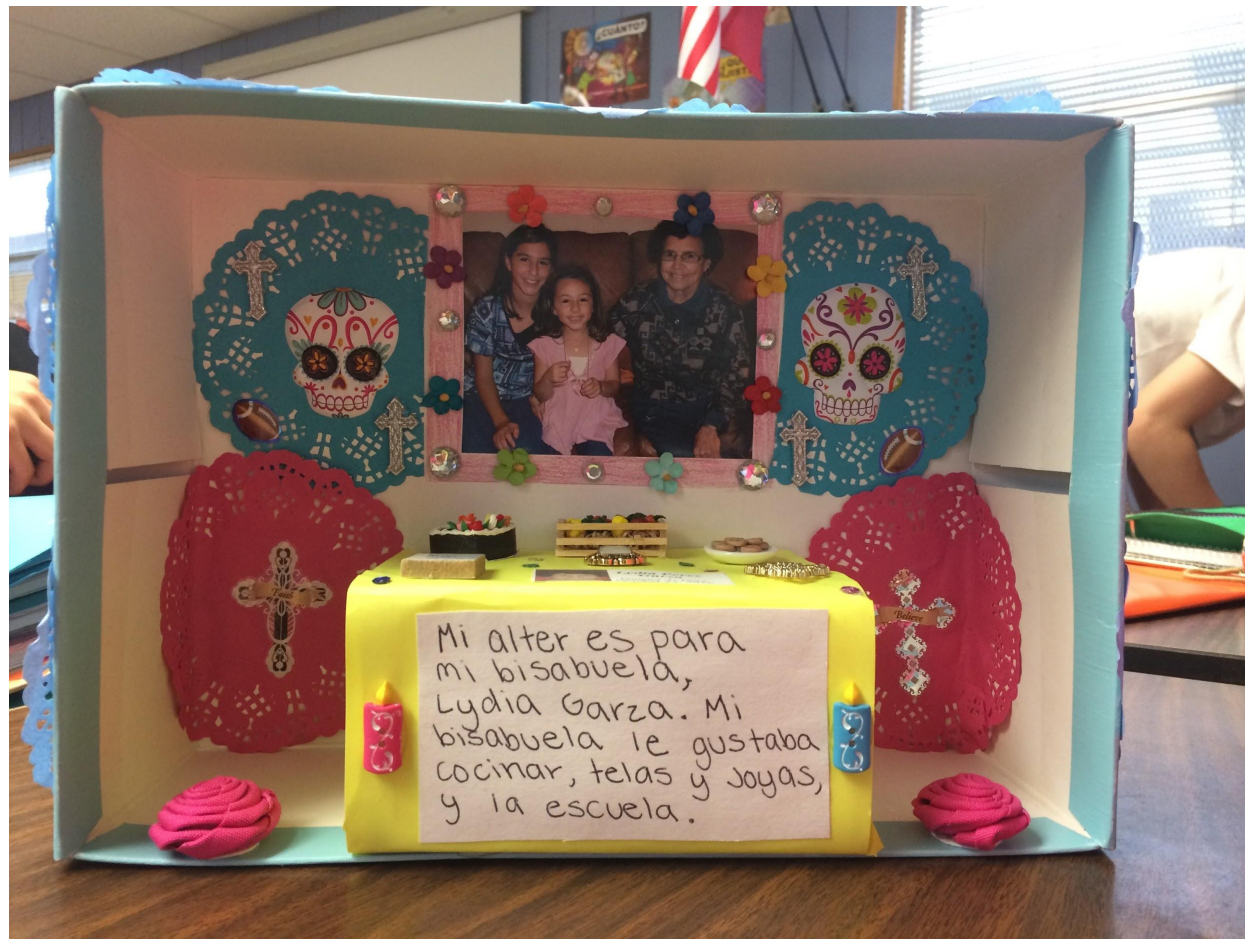

- Do you decorate your home? If so, how?

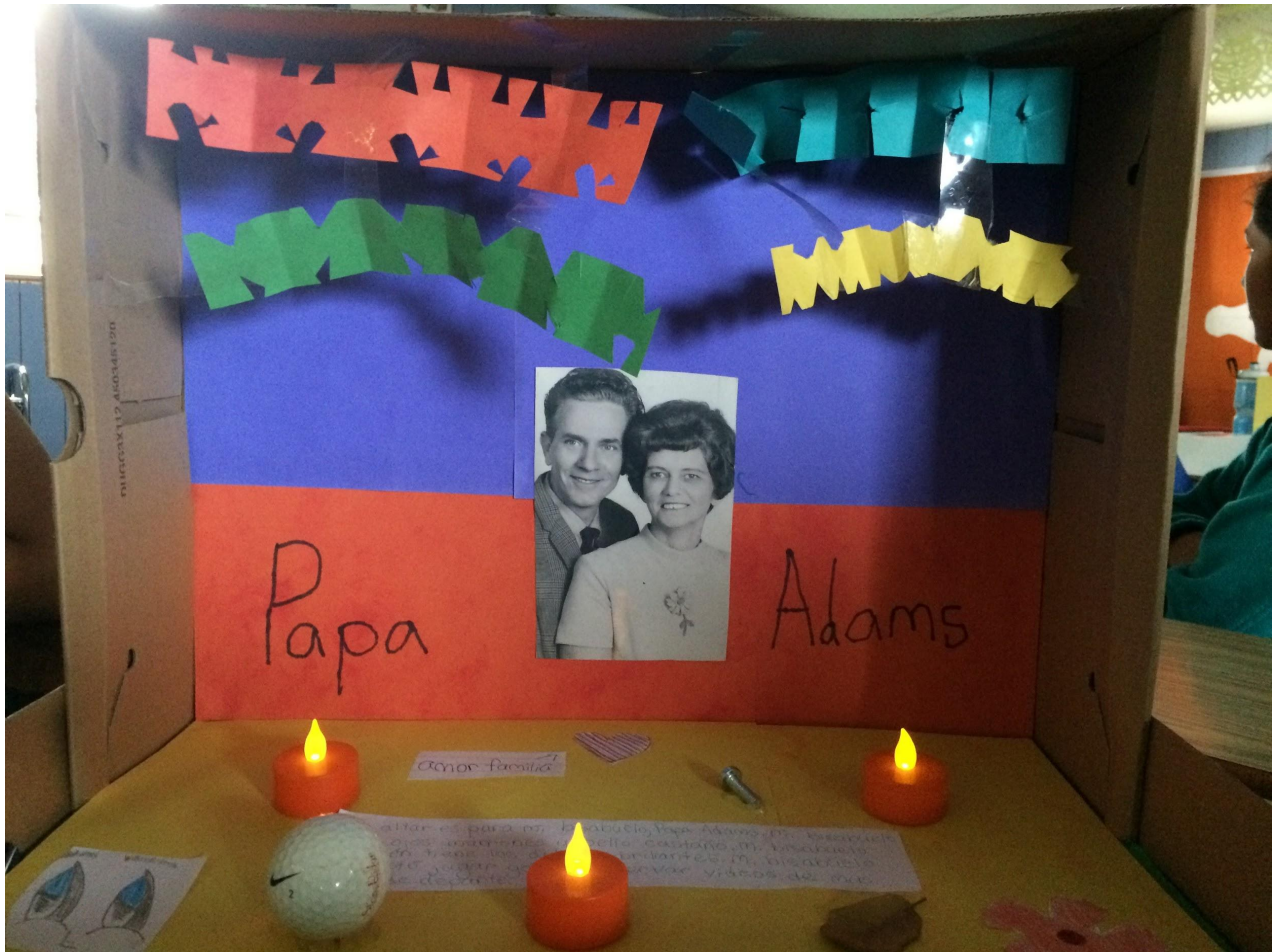

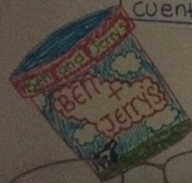
